In response to the COVID-19 Pandemic, Governor Newsom signed AB 361 into law, amending certain provisions in the Ralph M. Brown Act ("Brown Act") allowing public agencies to continue conducting remote virtual meetings during a state of emergency, without the need to comply with all of the Brown Act's teleconferencing prerequisites, so long as certain requirements are met. Specifically, public agencies must make specific findings, every 30 days, and must ensure conditions related to public participation are satisfied. On February 3, 2022, the SCUSD Governing Board adopted Resolution 3248, finding that the current circumstances meet the requirements of AB 361 and Government Code section 54953 for the Board and any other District committee to conduct meetings remotely for the next 30 days.
