



#### **RESOLUTION NO. 3042**

Resolution Regarding Sufficiency or Insufficiency of Instructional Materials: Education Code Section 60119

WHEREAS, the governing board of the Sacramento City Unified School District is committed to providing appropriate instructional materials for all students; and

WHEREAS, the governing board of the Sacramento City Unified School District, in order to comply with the requirements of Education Code Section 60119, held a public heating 18, 2018, at, or about 6:30 p.m, which is before the eighth week of school which did not take place during or immediately following school hours, and;

WHEREAS, the governing board provided at least 10 days notice of the public hearing posted in at least three places within the district stating the time, place and purpose of the lagrading,

WHEREAS, the governing board encouraged participation by parents, teachers, members of the community, and bargaining unit leaders in the public hearing, and;

WHEREAS, the definition of "sufficient textbooks or instructional materials" signifies pupil including English learner sastextbooks instructional materials, or both, to use in class and to take home, and;

WHEREAS, information provided at the public hearing and to the governing board at the public meeting detailed the extent to which textbooks or instructional materials were provided to pupils of the Sacramento City Unified School District, and;

WHEREAS, sufficient textbooks or instictional materials were provided to each student which are aligned to the academic content standards and consistent with the cycled and content of the curriculum frameworks in English Language Alfiscluding the English Language Development component of an adopted program Mathematics, Science, Histospocial Studies, Foreign Language and Health, and;

WHEREAS, laboratoryscience equipment is available for science laboratory classes offered in grades 9 – 12, inclusive;

THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED, for the 2018 2019 school year, the Sacramento City Unified School District Board of Education has provided each pupil with sufficient textbooks and instructional materials aligned to the academic content standards and consistent with the cycles and curriculum frameworks.
